

Chris Sabis heads Sherrard Roe Voigt & Harbison's Government Compliance & Investigations group. Chris concentrates his practice in the areas of government investigations, litigation, white collar litigation, and alternative dispute resolution. He has extensive experience in False Claims Act matters involving allegations of healthcare and procurement fraud, white-collar fraud investigations, and commercial litigation. In addition to his regular duties, he was the District's Elder Justice Coordinator and International Affairs Coordinator. Chris has served as a Hearing Examiner for the Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility and is a member of the Tennessee Bar Association, where he has served as Chair and Vice Chair of the Federal Practice Section, and the Nashville Bar Association, where he was Chair of the Historical Committee. Chris is currently a fellow of the Academy of Court-Appointed Neutrals, and a member of the American Bar Association and the Federal Bar Association. He is a past chair of the Board and member of the Honorary Board of Stars Nashville, a non-profit focused on the social development of children in Tennessee schools. He is the Past Chair of the Board of Autism Tennessee and has been an Adjunct Professor of Law at Belmont University where he taught Pretrial Litigation.
